Irish Cancer Patients Are Amongst First in World to Receive Newest Cancer Drugs. Thanks to Clinical Trials.

The importance of access to clinical trials for cancer patients in Ireland was highlighted at the launch of Cancer Week Ireland 2015.

According to the most recent figure from the Irish Clinical Oncology Research Group (ICORG) currently 10% of Irish patients diagnosed with cancer were enrolled on a ICORG sponsored study in 16 hospitals sites across the country. Of these just over 3% are involved in drug trials where they receive access to new drugs. Research carried out this year by ICORG demonstrated that 50% of patients sign up for clinical trials because they believe they will receive the best possible medicine while 46% choose clinical trials because they want to help others in the future.
